

COVID-19 Scenario Factsheet

WHAT TO DO IF...

ACTION NEEDED

RETURN TO COLLEGE WHEN

My child has COVID-19 symptoms.

- **DO NOT COME TO COLLEGE.**
- Contact the college to inform us.
- Self-isolate the whole household.
- <https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/> gives details of COVID-19 symptoms.
- Get a test for your child or anyone who is symptomatic in the household.
- Inform the college immediately about the test result.

The test comes back negative or a period of 10 days has passed since the symptoms started, and your child does not have symptoms other than cough or loss of sense of smell or taste (these symptoms can last for several weeks).

If they still have a high temperature, they must continue to self-isolate until their temperature returns to normal.

My child tests positive for COVID-19.

- **DO NOT COME TO COLLEGE**
- Contact the college to inform us.
- Agree an earliest date for possible return (minimum of 10 days)
- Self-isolate the whole household (household members only need to get tested if they are symptomatic).

10 days have passed since the symptoms started, and your child does not have symptoms other than cough or loss of sense of smell or taste (these symptoms can last for several weeks).

If they still have a high temperature, they must continue to self-isolate until their temperature returns to normal.

My child tests negative.

- Contact the college to inform us.
- Discuss when your child can come back (same day/next day).

The test comes back negative.

My child is ill with symptoms not linked to COVID-19.

- **DO NOT COME TO COLLEGE**
- Contact the college to inform us.
- Ring on each day of illness.

After 48 hours following the last bout of sickness or diarrhoea.

Someone in my household has COVID-19 symptoms.

- **DO NOT COME TO COLLEGE.**
- Contact the college to inform us.
- Self-isolate the whole household.
- Household member to get a test.
- Child does not need a test unless symptomatic.
- Inform college immediately of test result.

The test comes back negative.

WHAT TO DO IF...

ACTION NEEDED

RETURN TO COLLEGE WHEN

Someone in my household tests positive for COVID-19.

- **DO NOT COME TO COLLEGE.**
- Contact the college to inform us.
- Agree an earliest date for possible return (minimum of 14 days.)
- Self-isolate the whole household

The child has completed 14 days of isolation.

NHS test and trace has identified my child as a close contact of somebody with symptoms or confirmed COVID-19.

- **DO NOT COME TO COLLEGE.**
- Contact the college to inform us.
- Agree an earliest date for possible return (minimum of 14 days)

The child has completed 14 days of isolation.

NHS test and trace has identified a household member (other than my child) as a close contact of somebody with symptoms or confirmed COVID-19.

- The household member must self-isolate for 14 days.
- Child can continue to attend college.

The child can continue to attend college.

A sibling attending another school/college has been sent home to self-isolate due to there being a positive case in their school/college.

- The sent home sibling must self-isolate for 14 days.
- Child can continue to attend college.

The child can continue to attend college.

My child has travelled abroad from a country or territory that is NOT on the exempt list of countries.

- **DO NOT COME TO COLLEGE.**
- If returning from a destination- where quarantine is needed.
- Minimum of 14 days self-isolation for all those that travelled.
- Contact the college to inform us you are back in the country and we will agree an earliest date for possible return to college.
- Self-isolate the whole household.

The quarantine period of 14 days has been completed.

WHAT TO DO IF...

ACTION NEEDED

RETURN TO COLLEGE WHEN

My child has travelled abroad from a country or territory that IS on the exempt list of countries.

- If returning from a destination where quarantine is NOT needed.
- Check the current exempt countries and territories list at <https://www.gov.uk/foreign-travel-advice> to confirm the country you have travelled from or through is on the exempt list.
- Ring the college to inform us you have returned to the UK and

You have informed the college of your return to the UK and you are exempt from self-isolation.

I have travelled from a country that requires us to quarantine (but my child did not travel).

- As long as you do not have/have not had symptoms in the last 14 days, your child can continue to attend college.
- The person who has travelled MUST NOT leave the house, including to do pick-ups and drop-offs.

The child can continue to attend college.

We have received medical advice that my child must resume shielding.

- **DO NOT COME TO COLLEGE.**
- Contact the college to inform us.
- Shield until you are informed that restrictions are lifted and shielding is paused again.

The college inform you that restrictions have been lifted and your child can return to college again. You receive medical advice that your child may return to college.

There is confirmed case of COVID at the College.

- Attend College as normal unless your child has been contacted by NHS test and trace or the College as someone who has been in close contact with an individual who has tested positive.
- The College will work with NHS test and trace to identify affected students.
- If contacted by NHS test and trace or the College, do not come into college.
- Contacted students should follow the guidance above and self-isolate for 14 days.

The child has completed 14 days of self-isolation.

I am unable to get a test for someone in the household.

- If you are unable to get a test in the first 5 days of having symptoms, your child and your household must self-isolate for 14 days.

The child has completed 14 days of self-isolation.
