Introduction

This document briefly outlines the experience of our appointed external education advisory committee members.

Safeguarding Education Advisor: Sherry Ralph

Sherry Ralph is the Chief Executive Officer of the Independent Custody Visiting Association (ICVA) a national charity leading, supporting and representing volunteers who monitor police custody across the UK. She also sits on the steering group for the United Kingdom National Preventive Mechanism, drawing together monitoring organisations for all types of detention in the UK to prevent ill-treatment. She has a Master's Degree in Human Rights Law from Birkbeck University, achieved in 2021.

Sherry has a long history of working in the criminal justice sector in particular with young people having worked in prisons, delivered contracts for prison leavers and been the Youth Services Manager for a charity offering services for gang affected young people. She has also held roles in housing allocations policy and contract management for a domestic violence service.
